THE 411 on YAP

The Youth Advocate Program is a three-year professional development program for current and former dependents of Alameda County foster care and juvenile probation youth (ages 18-21). Youth Advocate Fellows provide trainings for child welfare workers, panel discussions, focus groups, policy feedback in subcommittees and workgroups, direct youth outreach through the completion of projects, and participation in Team Decision Making meetings and Transitional Living Conferences. Fellows also receive professional development opportunities – a rigorous training curriculum, on-the-job coaching, individual goal planning, supportive services, and an opportunity to work towards educational and professional goals.
