

## **Honorable Stacy Boulware Eurie, Presiding Juvenile Court Judge, Sacramento County Superior Court**

The Honorable Stacy Boulware Eurie was appointed to the Superior Court of California in June 2007. Prior to her appointment to the bench, Judge Boulware Eurie served as Senior Assistant Attorney General of the Government Law Section of the California Office of the Attorney General. She also served as deputy attorney general in the Attorney General's Employment, Regulation and Administration section and as an associate attorney in a private criminal defense law firm. During her legal career, Judge Boulware Eurie's practice areas included complex political and constitutional law, governmental affairs, state and federal employment defense, administrative law and criminal defense. She received her undergraduate degree from UCLA and her law degree from the University of California, Davis.

Judge Boulware Eurie has been an active member of the California legal community for almost 20 years. In addition to her multiple years of service on the Executive Committee of the California State Bar's Litigation Section, Judge Boulware Eurie served as President of the Sacramento County Bar Association and Judicial Master of the Anthony M. Kennedy and Schwartz/Levi American Inns of Court. Judge Boulware Eurie currently serves on the California Child Welfare Council, a legislatively created multi-agency advisory body responsible for improving collaboration among the broad range of agencies that serve children and youth in the child welfare and foster care system. She is the Chair of California Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakayue's Keeping Kids in School and Out of Court Initiative Steering Committee (KKIS), a member of California's State Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's Disproportionate Minority Contact Subcommittee, and an executive member of the Commission on the Future of California's Court System. She has previously served on the Council of State Governments Justice Center's School Discipline Consensus Project and the California Blue Ribbon Commission on Children in Foster Care.

As the Presiding Judge of Sacramento's Juvenile Court and as a member of the California CSEC Action Team, Judge Boulware Eurie has worked with members of the judiciary, community based agencies, and representatives from the fields of child welfare, juvenile justice, mental health, and education to develop greater public awareness and understanding of the need for trauma-informed practices and services to support those youth who have been commercially sexually exploited. She has implemented a nationally-recognized trauma-informed and multi-disciplinary court docket for youth who have been commercially sexually exploited and consulted with other jurisdictions on how courts can improve their effectiveness in overseeing this unique and complex population. She has also worked with jurisdictions around California to facilitate enhanced learning and exchanging of ideas about proven strategies to reduce overuse of school exclusionary discipline practices and improve school climate, particularly for system involved youth.
